

Tribute to Alloy Lee Ha

Hailing from the humble fishing village of Mayaro, Alloy Lee Ha was a legendary teacher to many generations of students at Fatima College.

Fatima student from 1954 to 1959, he represented the school in Cricket, Football, Chess, and Badminton, and was a Scholarship winner. When he returned to Fatima as a teacher in 1966, he taught Maths and Add Maths, as well as English Language, English Literature, French, Spanish, Latin, History and Geography. He was head of the department for Maths and Languages and served as Deans of Forms 3 and 5. He even served as Form 6 Dean, as well as Acting School Principal, both for short periods of time.

A number of Fatima teachers were actually students of Mr. Lee Ha. At different times, he taught Mr. Clifford Roach, Mr. Brash, Mr. Pierre, Mr. Joseph, Mr. Cooper, Mr. Ramdass and Fr. Mc Phillip.

Mr. Lee Ha retired in 2001 after 35 years of service, and passed away on the 24th of April 2024. He has left an indelible impression on all who were taught by him.

Jeanette set the bar high for the female teachers that followed. Fatima can boast of their teachers who are dedicated to the vocation and Jeanette was the key stone. May she rest in peace.

Dr Bernard Tappin, who served as Vice-Principal of Fatima College from 1991-2000, passed away on 14th February 2014



Living the Grey Shirt – Garvin Warwick

After being a basketball player for 10 years, Garvin Warwick (Class of 1997) joined the Fatima College basketball program in 2010 as a way to start giving back to his alma mater. He was Assistant Head Coach for two years before Fr. Gregory asked him to spearhead the program in 2012.

While the College has won 10 divisional titles, The National Championships Competition was resumed in 2023 after a 10-year hiatus. The Under-15s went undefeated for the entire season and were crowned National Under-15 Champions; the Under-17s also went undefeated for the season, eventually crowned National Champions. In 2024, Fatima captured titles in the Under-15, Under-17 and Under-20 divisions.

Garvin has held many leadership positions in sport including Executive Member of the Trinidad and Tobago Olympic Committee (April 2013–November 2017), President of the National Basketball Federation of Trinidad and Tobago (March 2014–January 2016), and Advisor to the Minster of Sport and Youth (March 2016–April 2018).

With the need for showcasing the talent of the Caribbean, Garvin and his team established the company "Next Level Performance TT" (NPL) in 2022, with the aim of bridging the gap between Caribbean athletes and the US and Canadian Collegiate systems and coaches. Their mission is to assist student athletes to build a profile that is detailed for College and University scouts. Garvin was involved as well in the formation of Spartans TT Sports Club, an organisation which helps in cultivating the athletic potential of young aspiring athletes in Trinidad and Tobago. https://www.facebook.com/SpartansTT

Why did you select Fatima?

My two older brothers Nicholas and Garth Warwick attended Fatima College. Being a younger sibling, in Primary School I attended all the Intercol matches and became a Fatima fan.

How was your experience at Fatima pleasant and/or non-pleasant; worst mischief, etc.

A Fatima College days were the best days of my life. I tell stories to my players all the time. I accredit my willingness to give back to Fatima College to Fr Gregory Augustine and and Mrs Hubbard, because they saw something in me that I didn't see in myself, and they gave me opportunities to lead and manage the basketball Form 1 League as well as other activities at the College.

What sports, if any, did you participate in in Fatima?

I played Basketball of course, but also played Football. Played in a few Second Eleven games too.

Who was your favourite teacher(s) and which teacher(s) did you give the most trouble.

My favorite teachers were Fr Gregory Augustine and Mrs Hubbard (Geography) 'Trouble' was Mrs Kublalsingh and Mr Gibson (Principles of Business). But with age brings wisdom. (I thank them all immensely for their patience and dedication.)

Have you been able to maintain friendships with your classmates since school? Any class reunions?

All my good friends to this day are my College mates—Miguel Cielto, Damion Hepburn Brent Radix Kayle Nurse, Sean Inness...to name just a few.

What was your academic path immediately after Fatima, and how did you get onto the basketball court.

After Fatima, I went on to work at TSTT in 1999. There I was in Sales, and because I was introduced to Marketing and Advertising campaigns, I decided to do a diploma in Marketing...and the rest is history. I now hold a Master's in Strategic Marketing from Anglia Ruskin University. After my studies in Marketing, and my picking up coaching, I went on to further my academic progress with a diploma in the Art and Science of Coaching from the University of the West Indies, plus I secured my FIBA Level 1 Certification (International Certification). I went on to do a post-graduate diploma in



Sports Management at the UWI, attaining First-Class honours and election as Class Valedictorian. I coach not only at Fatima College but also at Holy Name Convent and for Spartans TT. My education in basketball is always literally on-the-go and on-going as I travel annually to join coaches and programmes in the US, to learn new and advanced training techniques.

- Tell us about the evolution of Fatima basketball since you took over the program. What have been the most important/significant changes? What have been the highlights? Whether there's still room for improvement?
- Since taking over the basketball programme in 2012, it has been all about developing a 'winning culture', on and off the court. In my first year, we finished 2nd in U17 and 3rd in U15. But that was based on the talent of one or two players who were in the programme. It was not until the 2015-16 season we started seeing the fruits of our labour: we won the U15 North Zone School League Title—the first in the school's history!

In 2017, we captured the U20 North Zone School Basketball Title. But our best two seasons turned out to be 2022-2023 and 2023-2024...having captured all North Zone School Basketball Titles in both seasons, as well as five Trinidad and Tobago Schools Basketball Titles. We brought home the coveted National U20 Title to Fatima College! With only two of the three National titles captured in our last two outings, we still need to capture all three in the same year!!

What were your main responsibilities during your time as Executive Member of the Trinidad and Tobago Olympic Committee?

My role was to support the Marketing efforts, and that was a part of the President's overallcampaign "10Gold24".

- With the Paris Summer Olympics on the horizon, is there anything in particular that has your attention, that you are looking forward to seeing?
- As a marketer, I always love to see the creativity of the Opening Ceremony. We'll enjoy seeing our Trinbago athletes showing off the red, white and black. Of course, I'm always locked into the basketball, with my favorite players LeBron James and Aja Wilson trying to bring high glory for Team USA.
- Q You are also the the Assistant Coach of the National Under-17 Girls' Basketball
- Team. How do you balance all your work, Q
- school and home responsibilities?
 It's always challenging, but it requires proper scheduling, and understanding organizations, as well as a supportive family. My wife and kids are very supportive of my basketball coaching career. They understand the work I put into it, and that it's not just a hobby but a way of life.
- You obviously have a passion for developing youth sports and beyond. What do you see as your overall mission/goal?

Living the Grey Shirt – Fatima Teacher Kwasi Noel

Kwasi Noel (Class of 2001/2003), has been a member of the Fatima Staff since 2007. He teaches French and Spanish and has been a Dean since 2015 (Form 6 until December 2023; Form 4 from January 2024 to present).



"Gifts of Blue and Gold" ("GOBAG"), the Fatima Annual November Concert, was started in 2009 as a fundraiser concert for the Form 5 graduation. It was then under the leadership of the College's Choir Director Kwasi Noel. The concert has now grown and become a tradition, staged in the Hall at Fatima. Moreover, it has become an opportunity for the College's various music groups to showcase what they learned in their extracurricular activity, outside the realm of competition. Most of the performances are by the Choirs of the College, but there are displays of musical talent by the various instrumental groups and instrumentalists who collaborate to form The Orchestra. Additionally, singers from Holy Name Convent have become welcome participants in the production.

Why did you choose to attend Fatima as a student?

I came from a family of devout Catholics. Particularly so was my maternal grandmother, who as part of her faith, often prayed the Rosary and loved the Church's Marian doctrines. She was born in 1917 and thus grew up learning about the apparitions of Our Lady in Fatima in Portugal, as occurred in 1917. As a result, my attending a school consecrated to Our Lady of Fatima was a given for my family. At my age then, I had no understanding other than that I wanted to pass for Fatima College!

How was your experience at Fatima pleasant and/or non-pleasant; worst mischief, etc?.

A Looking back now, it was no different to any of life's circumstances or anyone's school life: there were great times, I encountered amazing people, and there were the tumultuous days of challenges—all amalgamating to help me to be an adult who could make some sort of useful contribution to society.

- What sports, if any, did you participate in in Fatima?
- For a little while I was into swimming, which I continued to do beyond my Fatima years.
- Who was your favourite teacher(s), who was the scariest teacher(s) and which teacher(s) did you give the most trouble?
- I had great respect for all my teachers but Madame Allison Poon (and everyone knew this) was my favourite and scariest—an amazing dichotomy when I think of it. I wouldn't say that I was a trouble-maker (my mother was a teacher too!).

Have you been able to maintain friendships with your classmates since school? Any class reunions?

Yes, I remain in contact with friends from back then, and I ended up working with one of them at Fatima—he is now a priest: Fr. Maurice White.

Q Give us the 'back-story' about the Fatima music program, and your role as Fatima Choir Director.

Music has always been integral to life at Fatima and choral singing was a major part of this. Mr. Maurice Brash along with Ms. Myrtle Cumberbatch ran the choral program in my time as a student. With Mr. Brash's encouragement, a group of us who participated in Music Festival joined the Marionettes Chorale in 2002 when we were in Lower 6, and my interest and skills in choral singing (because singing in a choir is a different skill) grew and flourished there.

When I joined the Fatima Staff in 2007, I saw myself as just helping out, especially since I replaced Mr. Brash in the French/Spanish department. I never would have thought my involvement would have evolved into my leading the choir.



I think the music program has really grown. What existed has expanded, and what wasn't there before was created—all due to the commitment of many stakeholders (teachers, parents, students, individual alumni and FOBA itself as an organization.) In addition to Ms. Cumberbatch (who remains as our accompanist), several other persons are keeping music alive at Fatima: Music Teachers Ms. Nivedita Nobbee & Mr. Akil Patrick; Pan Directors Mr. Roy Edwards and his daughter Roisha, and Mr. Leon Grey, an old-boy and now Fatima parent who runs the Drumming Ensemble.

- GOBAG last year (2023) celebrated 15 years of stagings. Tell us about how you got involved back in 2009 and how it has evolved over the years, and about the eventual involvement of the Holy Name singers.
- When I was a student, from 1996 2003, Fatima never had a major school concert. Back then, I would have wished that such productions existed. In September 2009, I took on the task of coordinating the Form 5 Graduation, and at a planning meeting, Mr. Michael Roberts, an old-boy and one of the parents of the boys of the class of 2010, suggested a concert as a fundraiser! That became a good excuse to get something off the ground something I would have wanted to have seen happen at the College when I was a student.

It was also made easier because the then newly-installed Principal Fr. Gregory was all for it, and he gave me full support. Particularly in those early years, when I had less experience as a 'Project Manager', nothing was spared to ensure the success of the show. I like to think that FOBA's construction of the mezzanine and upgrades to the Hall were made because of GOBAG (well I know it was at least part of it).

Unitus and Competere - FOBA/St. Mary's College Past Students Union Joint Christmas Dinner

Fatima, CIC embark on kindred spirit of unity

The Fatima Old Boys Association and the St Mary's College Past Students Union (CICPSU) are trying to put aside the concept of rivalries between the two institutions and work together for the commonality and betterment of their students.

On December 7th 2023, the first step in this process was made as the two entities met at the Fatima College Hall along Mucurapo Road, St James, for a dinner that was themed 'Unitus and Competere'.

It was attended by past students of both esteemed colleges, who both gave their assurances to work together to ensure the betterment of both institutions.

Father Gregory Augustine, Chairman of the Holy Ghost Fathers told the Express that the idea for the collaboration came about in July during a mission of the Holy Ghost Fathers.

"We've had a friendly rivalry over the years but this year, with all that's happened in recent times, and what's going on in the world with so much division and alienation, we opted to have an initiative together. To come together and find the best path forward for each college, in terms of challenges and opportunities, but doing so working hand in hand. And we didn't want this to be something only in words and platitudes, we wanted it to be tangible. So, we came together and organized the way forward and decided to do some initiatives together. This dinner was the meeting in preparation for this step, and we have other things planned including fundraisers and parties, and other such things," Fr. Augustine said.

He said that he believed that both schools, and even their past student unions, can learn from one another, and he hoped that it would be a step for the betterment of all colleges in the future, not just CIC and Fatima.

"We all are unique, yes. But there is a commonality. A kindship of spirit. Born from the excellence that both schools and their students try to achieve. And that expands not just to the students, but to any national of this country. We are human beings, and we all should be looking out for each other and supporting each other. It should not be a competition, or bitterness, or jealousy thing. We all need that sense of community which has been

eroded over the last few years. If one succeeds, we all succeed, and it should not be a situation where we are angry at another, or because they are from different schools or communities that we do not help one another.

"We need unity, not just in our schools, but in our country as a whole. And this is just one of the first steps these committees can use to hopefully bring us to this. Cause we all come from common heritages and even experiences. We are far more alike than we are different, and this is what we need to focus on. Yes, we are still schools and we have to ensure the legacy of academic excellence continues. But we would also like to believe that schools are more than a place to beat books. They are institutions of learning, what it means to be an adult, a worker, a brother, a husband, a father, a human being. We want to start emphasizing the importance of the excellence of being a human being and why the motto is 'Together we aspire, together we achieve'," Augustine said.



Among the first of Fatima's female students were KARLA CAESAR and SHERRY-ANN CALLENDER. In actual fact, these students did only one subject at Fatima so they were still officially students of their respective schools, St. François Girls' College and Holy Name Convent. But no doubt they paved the way for progress, for in the following year, Fatima had its first ever full-time female student in the person of RAINA MAHABIR.

SHERRY-ANN CALLENDER studied Further Maths at Fatima from February 1988 to June 1989. Her teachers were Mr. G.


