Simon Farrell aka Beaker, Spiccolli (from Fast Times at Richmond High), Red Man

(October 15th 1966 – September 18th 2009)

Simon was born on 15th October 1966 in Pointe-a-Pierre, Trinidad.

After graduating from Fatima College in 1984, Simon began his career in the Advertising Industry with a two year apprenticeship in Graphic Design, Darkroom techniques and Lithographic Printing with Creative Advertising Ltd. He next took up the position of Assistant Production Manager and Graphic Artist with Horshams Printing Products.

Simon then diversified into Flexography at Caribbean Pre-Press Services and Systems Ltd. Where he learnt package design and was responsible for producing the artwork for blind embossing and foil blocks used by Hallmark Greeting Cards. After 14 years working in the printing industry, which included four years as the Senior Graphic Artist at T&T Printing Works Ltd., Simon moved into the Advertising arena.

He held the position of Senior Graphic Artist at The Edge Advertising Ltd., where he won two Gold Addy awards in 2001 for best press campaign in the Automotive and Alcohol Retail categories. In 2002 he was offered the position as Head of the Quality Assurance Department at Lonsdale Satchi and Satchi Advertising Ltd. And then the position of Manager of the Pre-Press Department at Caribbean Paper and Printed Products (1993) Ltd. In 2008 Simon resigned his position as the Promotions and Creative Design Coordinator at Value Optical Ltd. to start his own home based Graphic Design business. Over the years

Simon had worked on a free-lance basis for CLICO, CANTO, Intercommercial Bank, Burmac, Trinidad Aggregate Products, Caribe

Ceramics, Hilton Hotel, Ambassador Hotel, TSTT, TSTT Credit Union, Neal & Massy Credit Union, Beefeater, Subway, Yellow Submarine and ACM International to name a few. His international clients include Transitions Lenses Inc., Calvin Klein Eyewear and Simple Business Solutions of Lewisham, England who are consultant for the British Government.

He called his business: "Simon Farrell Graphic Designs" and offered the following services: Graphic design, Desktop Publishing, Package Design, Print Brokerage, Radio & Television Advertising Production, Fleet Vehicle Graphics, Indoor & Outdoor Signage, Billboards, Website Design & Maintenance, & Specialty Promotional Items.

He was an avid fisherman, and the family teased him by saying that the biggest thing he ever caught was himself! Besides fishing, he loved surfing, camping, snorkelling, spear-fishing, scuba-diving, sailing, boating, hiking, listening to Rock & Reggae music and camping. In fact, he used to camp in Paria, with his family, from as early as ten years old.

Simon was not financially wealthy, but he was rich in spirit — he had fortitude. He was charitable & affable. He loved his family very much and lived his life focussed on trying to take care of them and be there for them no matter what the circumstance. He leaves to mourn his daughter Celine, his mother Irene, his father, Haydn, his wife Alena, and his sister Andrea and of course all of his friends. He was laid to rest in a private burial at sea at the mouth of the first bocas near to the "tooth", "down-the-islands", one of his many favourite fishing spots, where he absolutely loved to be. May his soul now rest in peace!
