In an address to the students and teachers of the school, Minister Garcia praised the College for its success in academics and sporting activities. He attributed the school's success to its exceptional and dedicated teachers, as well as the parents' support group and the Fatima Old Boys' Association (FOBA)

He also commended the Association for its continued financial support that it renders to the sporting activities of the College. The Association is also responsible for the introduction of Smart Boards into the classrooms, thus making Fatima College one of the first secondary schools in the Caribbean to become e-compliant.

"Fatima boys are good boys," the Minister said, as he reminisced on the days he served as principal at the school.

Minister Garcia served as principal for nine (9) years, from 2000-2009. Father Gregory Augustine, the current Principal of the school, also offered kind words of encouragement to the Minister.

The Mystical Rose Prayer Group takes up the responsibility for the organization of all the readings for any significant feast day and other religious activities of the college.

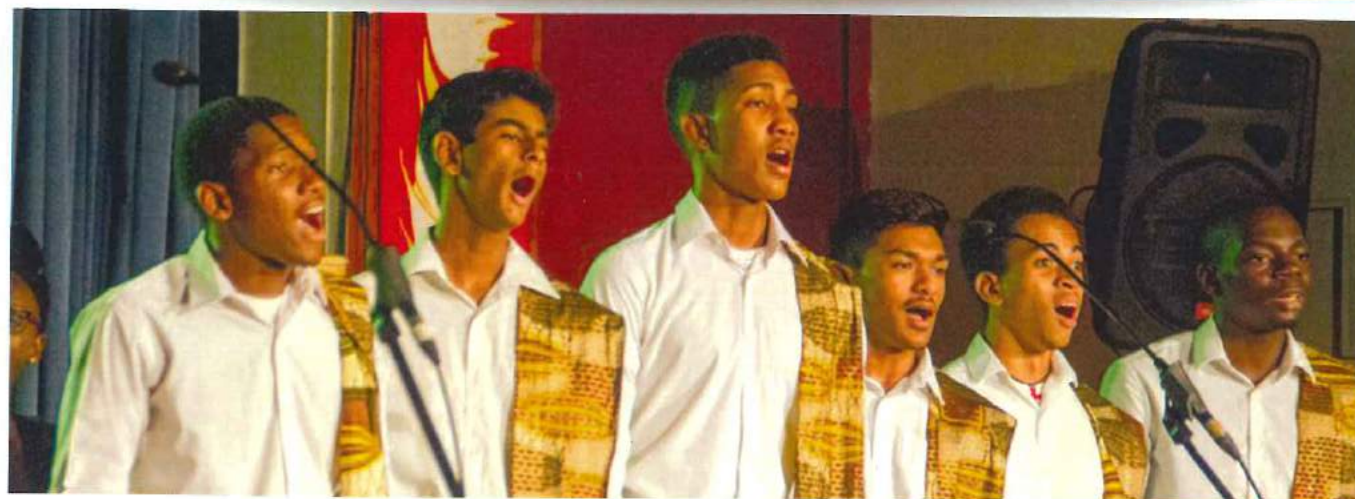
We visit homes such as the Simeana Home for the aged and the St. Dominic's Children's Home to shine a little light in their lives.

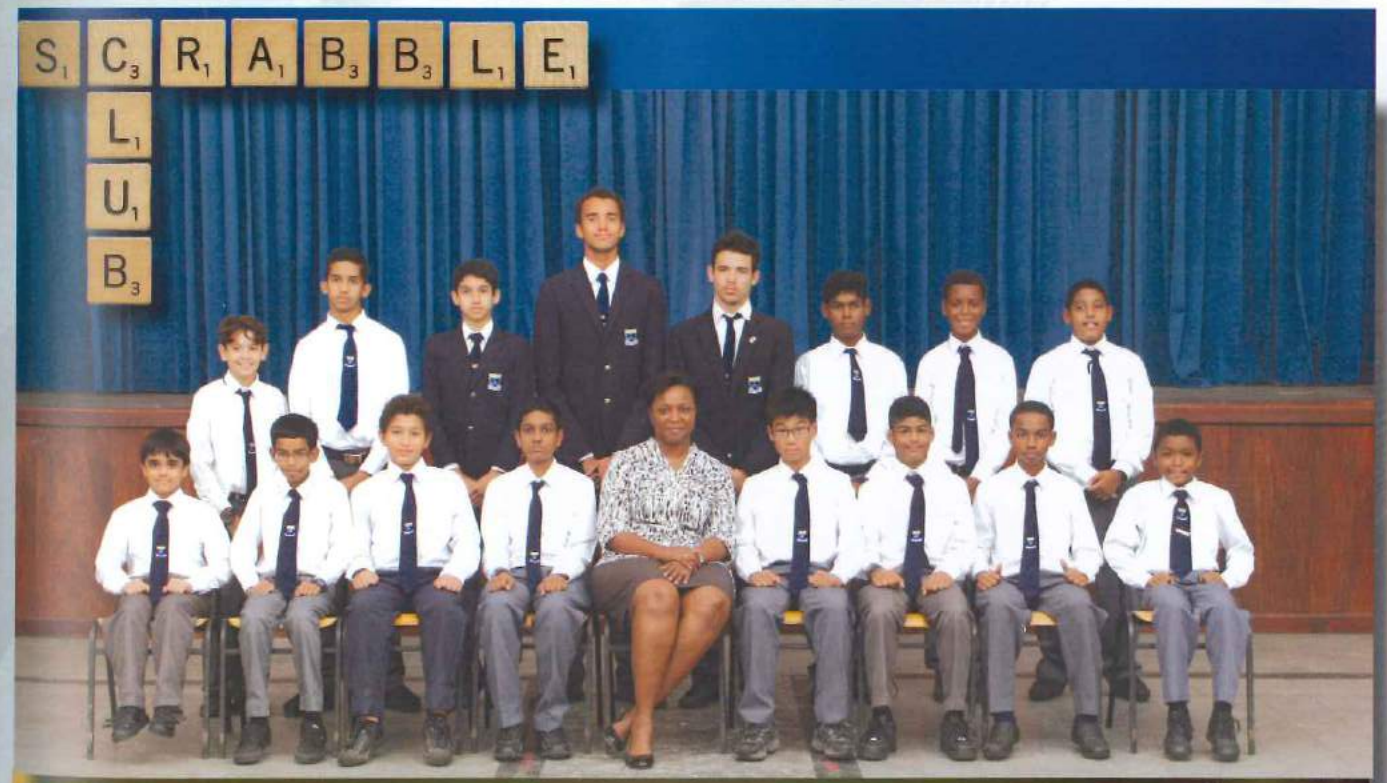

- The Stick Fighting Competition (Organised by Ms. Douglas)

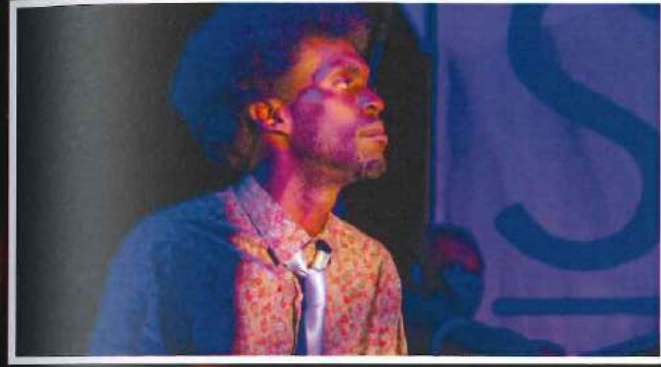
These new features made the show more vibrant and cultural and we wait with excitement to see what 2018 has to offer.

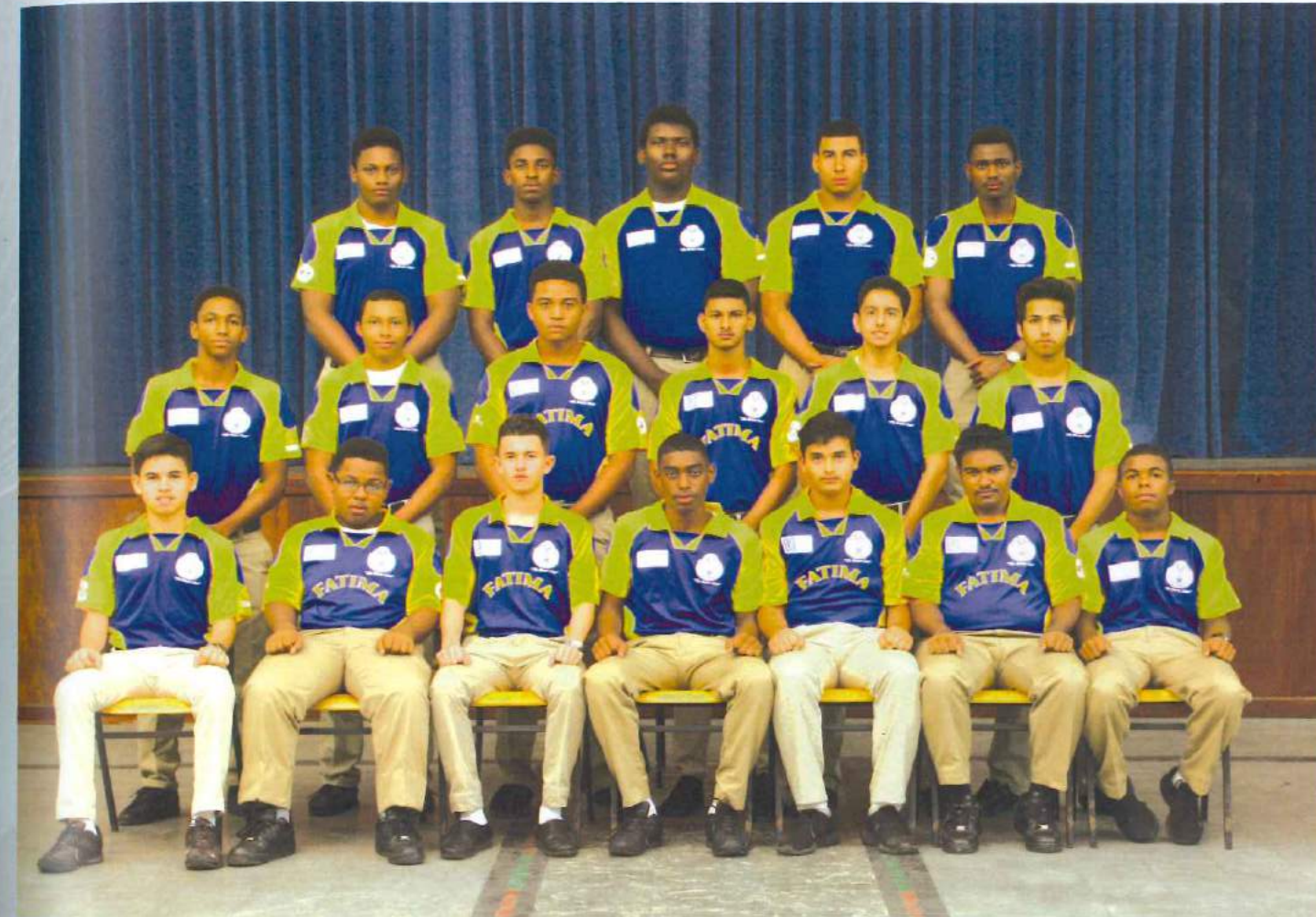

Fatima College Aquatics includes water polo and swimming, water polo being coached by Mr. Ryan West, supported by Mr. Gregorio Felician, and swimming, which is more of a "learn to swim" program, being coached by Mrs. Vanessa Otero, with parental support from Mrs. Dawn Hackett and Mrs. Sharon Ford. Training takes place on Saturdays at Flying Fish Swimming Pool in Federation Park, and on Mondays at Marlins in West Mornings, during Term 1 of the annual school year.

A major event in the annual school calendar is the Secondary School Water polo League, which for the 2016/2017 school year, ran from mid-January 2017 through mid-March 2017, with games being played on the weekends. Fatima College competed in four categories which included Fatima boys from Form 1 through Form 6 with the following results:

- ☑ Form 1 Team – Silver
- ☑ Under 14 Team – Silver
- ☑ Under 16 Team – Silver
- ☑ Open Team – Gold

Training of players commences in Term 1 of the school year with special focus on the Form 1's who play a version of the game referred to as "mini-polo".

This is played in the shallow end of the swimming pool. Focus is also on the Under 14 Team as most of the players would have transitioned from mini-polo and are still learning the game. One would find that the more experienced players, are enrolled in water polo clubs and it is recommended that club training be sought to improve skill levels.



All the Teams played their hearts out making the College proud and it is to the Fatima Open Team that we say an extra "Congratulations!" as this category was a strongly contested competition among Fatima College, St. Mary's College and Queen's Royal College.

The finals being played off at the National Aquatic Centre in Couva, between Fatima College and St. Mary's College; a win made sweeter as the Open Team came back from a loss in their first game of the League, showing the Fatima dedication and determination to succeed.

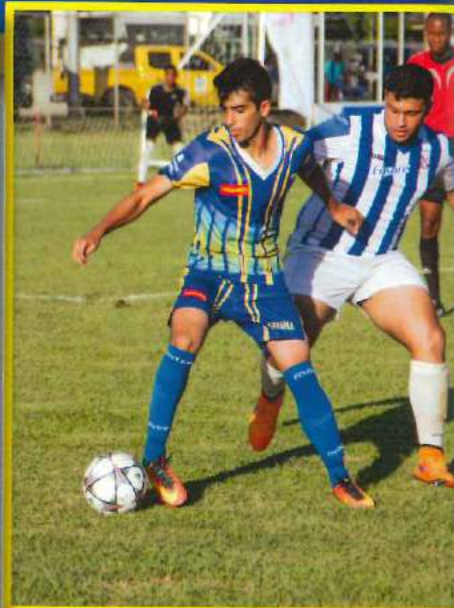
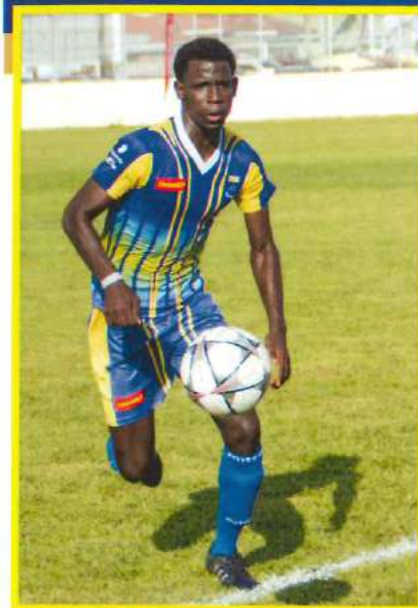

(1) TTSRFU League among (7) seven U18 teams

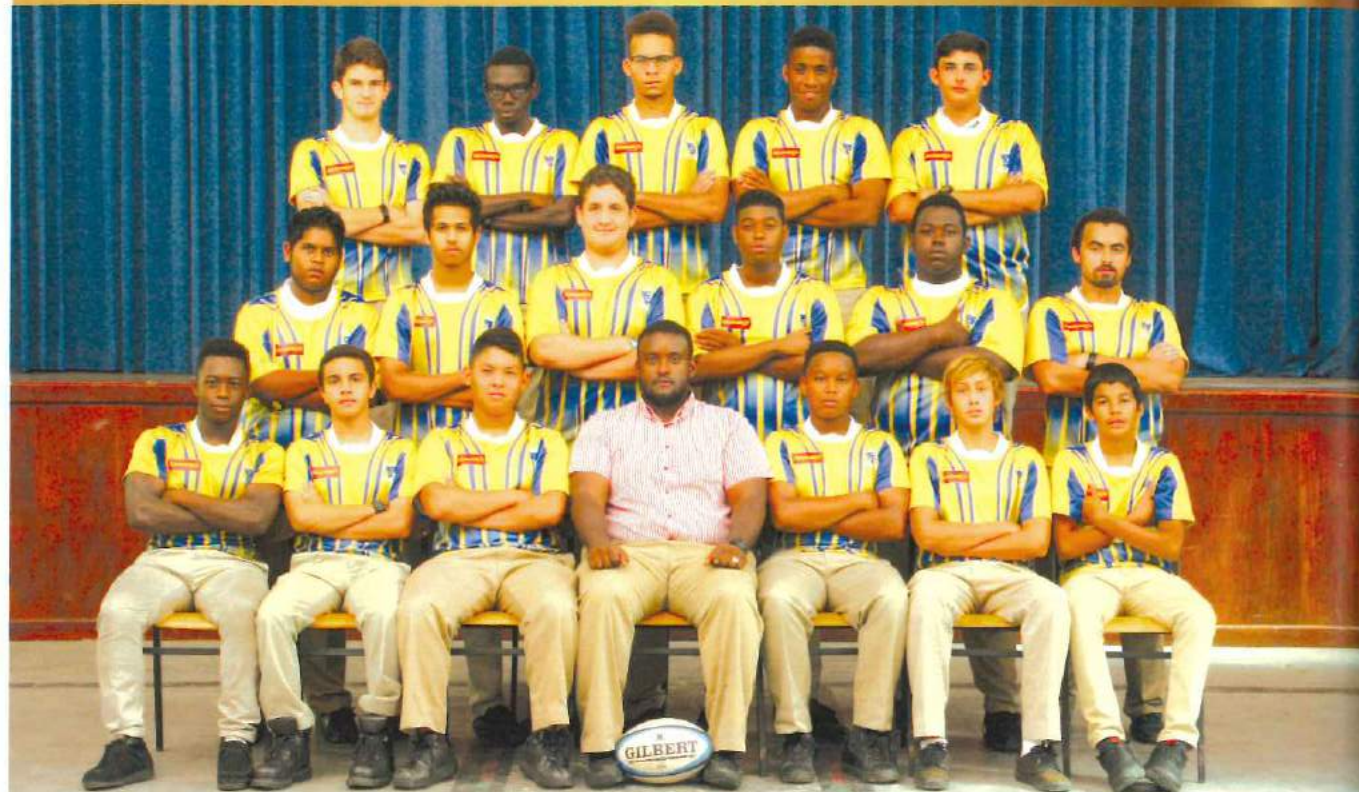
