

# **PRINCIPAL'S ADDRESS**

The year 2020 marks the 75th Jubilee of Fatima College. It began with our Anniversary Mass on Friday 17th January with the Archbishop Jason Gordon as Chief Celebrant assisted by three other Bishops, Archbishop Harris, Bishop Galt and Bishop Llanos of St. John's, Antigua himself an Old Boy. Also present were: the Superior General of the Holy Ghost Fathers Fr. John Fogarty, whose official visit coincided with that of the Anniversary Celebration, Priests of the Diocese, Government Officials, Religious Sisters, Old Boys, Parents, Teachers and Students of the College. This splendid evening culminated a cocktail reception in the quadrangle. Little did we know that this would possibly be the only official function of the Jubilee year. We did have our Sports Day and Carnival Show both branded with the Anniversary Logo and the Old Boys hosted the Annual Carnival Fete.



Then came March 12. This period provided us with an opportunity to stand back and reflect on our purpose as an Institution. I am proud to say that the response of the College to the Pandemic was exceptional. We were able to conquer many of the obstacles that presented themselves and to continue the excellence that is our tradition at Fatima. Mention must be made of the devoted staff at Fatima College. All hands were on deck in the response to our online initiative. Classes were conducted every day ending at midday for forms 1 to 4. Forms 5 and 6 had already completed the syllabus and so were given past papers and class sessions in the afternoon. Every aspect of college life from Monday morning assembly, Heads and Deans Meetings, Parents Meetings, Prefects Meetings the Career Day (postponed from April to May), Marian Devotions, Mother's Day and Father's Day celebrations was held online.

The new Academic year which began on September 1, showed us the stark reality that virtual teaching and learning would continue for some time. On Friday 28th August, the staff met with Fr. Matthew D'Hereaux an old boy. He posed a challenge to us that this experience should not merely be consigned to memory but must be of meaning both personally and communally. This exhortation has influenced our operation for the past two months.

The Jubilee has called us to reflect upon our practice at Fatima, why we do what we do. Over the decades, the College has sought to offer a quality education. The Teachers who have worked here have shown a dedication and commitment beyond compare. In more recent years, the support of the parents has led to a collaboration that serves as a model for parental school involvement. Our Old Boys Association has a synergy with the College Administration that can only be described as near perfect. Lastly, our students have proven time and time again that those to whom much is given, much is expected. It is always heartening to see their response when a challenge is put before them. Fatima Boys truly answer the call fearlessly.

Fatima was born in the final year of the Second World War, a year of trial and of triumph. Seventy-five years later, we face a different trial, confident that we will conquer.



# FATIMA COLLEGE FORM 1 PANORAMA

#### Introduction

The Fatima College Form 1 Panorama is an interclass steelband competition for form 1 students, started in 2016 by chemistry lab assistant and past pupil, Duvano Garnes. This major component of the annual Fatima College Carnival Show models our Trinidad and Tobago National Panorama steelband competition, at a beginners level. Panorama offers students introductory exposure to learning about the national instrument of Trinidad and Tobago, the steelpan.

#### **Format**

The four steelband competitors: Forms 1-1, 1-2, 1-3 and 1-4 classes, each represent St Matthew, St Mark, St Luke and St John houses respectively. The pan teacher provides four suitable soca tunes in current rotation during that Carnival season. From this, each class captain chooses their soca tune, ensuring that the four competing classes do not pick the same tune. Then, the pan teacher, according to the aptitude and discipline of each class, develops the musical arrangements at scheduled pan practice sessions for each class. For competition, captains draw their playing positions for the order of appearance. Each class performs their less-than-five minute soca arrangement, with up to 26 pannists per class, accompanied by a designated rhythm section of non-form 1 students. An adjudicator panel evaluates the performances, the marks are tallied and, based on competition placement results, houses earn points that accumulate toward the "House" of the Year" title.

#### **Statistics**

Across five editions of Form 1 Panorama, 2016 - 2020, 393 certificates of participation had been awarded to Form 1 participants over the period where steady growth of interest was evident, especially among students with no prior pan experience. In 2020, 47% of the 90 Form 1 participants (i.e. 42 out of 90) had not touched a pan before their initial pan rehearsal. In fact, 58% of the 2020 champion class had absolutely no prior pan experience. Preparation of four classes for this competition collectively engaged 35 contact hours of pan rehearsals, mostly done during break times and lunch times.

#### Conclusion

Form 1 Panorama 2020, the 5th Edition, coincided with our College's 75th Anniversary. The 2020 champion, Form 1-3 (St Luke House) was awarded the challenge trophy, their fourth title in five years of the competition. The Form 1 Panorama culturally enriches our youth as it fosters awareness, acceptance and appreciation of our national blessing, the steelpan.

# The History of Gifts of Blue & Gold

In the Beginning... Gifts of Blue & Gold (GOBAG) was born out of the idea of a school concert as a Form 5 Graduation Fundraiser. The suggestion, came from a parent of the Class of 2010, at a planning meeting in September, 2009. That parent was in fact Mr. Michael Roberts, himself an old boy and father of Christian and Daniel Roberts who as students, played critical roles in the establishing of the production as a staple in the academic year and more than a decade later, and both continue to assist, ensuring the ongoing development of the show.

Back in 2009, staging a school concert here at Fatima seemed like an insurmountable task but, much like what obtains today, the parents assured the Principal and Staff of their unrelenting support in whatever way that the teachers needed to make it happen. The concert was intended to be a one-time event to be held on Friday 27th November, 2009. That same year, Trinidad & Tobago would host the 20th Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting from November 27th - 29th and given the uncertainty of traffic restrictions and concerns about incurring a loss due to low ticket sales, Gifts of Blue & Gold was held on Wednesday 25th November.

On that night, the school community looked on in pride at what was a novelty: not since the 1960s, under then Musical Director Fr. Tim Corcoran, had there been a major musical production in the College Hall. Through the years, particularly in the late 80's there were Christmas concerts and under the direction of Mr. Maurice Brash, the college staged a concert in 1995 as part of the institution's 50th anniversary celebrations. Celebratory post-Music Festival Recitals were held in 2002, 2004 and 2006. Nevertheless, for all intents and purposes, after being declared as an annual event by Fr. Gregory Augustine, Gifts of Blue & Gold represented a new addition and tradition to life at the College.

#### A Decade (and then some) of Dance, Song & Drama

Over the years, the production has grown from strength to strength, always seeking to showcase the talents and gifts of the students of Fatima College. Annually, there have been performances by individuals who excel in singing, musical instruments and even dance and drama.

The concert has become an opportunity for the College's various music groups to show case what they learn in the context of an extracurricular activity, outside of the realm of competition. Most of the performances come from the choirs of the College but also included are the various instrumental groups and instrumentalists who collaborate to form the orchestra. Furthermore, a beautiful feature of the production has been the participation of a contingent of singers from Holy Name Convent and a number of these girls are part of GOBAG's past, present and future. Some of these girls include Gabrielle Dempster, Paige Ribeiro-Agard, Regina Seabrun and Anika Ward all of whom as students of Holy Name were cast members but now as adults, are part of the team that directs and manages the production.

Another non-negotiable trade mark of the production is the fact that with the exception of the few adults who are around to assist in a myriad of ways, all the performances that are seen on the stage are delivered by students only (guest artistes are not allowed). In fact, for the very first concert there were plans to include a few guest artistes but it somehow did not work out and they could not participate. Perhaps it was providential and worked out in ways that were never even imagined.

#### **GOBAG: The "Not-A-Christmas-Concert" Christmas Concert...**

Though the production is always carded for the last weekend of November, the concert is not exclusively a Christmas-themed concert. Nonetheless, the true reason for the season consistently



rings through and is seen and heard in a wide range of musical genres from classical music to calypso.

The past eleven editions of Gifts of Blue & Gold each stand on its own, varying in theme and content but always delivering a message of hope and optimism. The cast members are consistently reminded that they are using their God-given talents to inspire, renew and soothe the souls of the audience and in so doing, they edify their own lives as well.

For the 2019 concert, the flagship performance came in the form of a musical entitled "The Gospel According to Reggae" and in honour of the United Nation's recognition of reggae as an international cultural treasure, various hits of the genre were performed. In 2018, the cast presented "A Jubilee Celebration of Music" in recognition of the milestone of staging ten consecutive years of productions. The theme of the 2017 concert paid tribute to the 100th Anniversary of the Apparitions of Our Lady of Fatima in Portugal; the 8th edition in 2016 was dedicated to the Church's Year of Mercy and given the special significance of the number "7", GOBAG 2015 featured the best of the first 6 concerts.





# The History of Gifts of Blue & Gold cont'd

The earlier years were just as varied. In 2014, GOBAG 6 was dedicated to children everywhere with the tag-line being "Celebrating Our Children". This production took a unique slant in which the cast and thus the audience were forced to confront, through some very dramatic scenes and undeniably "heavy" music, the scourge of abuses against the youth of our nation. Nonetheless, as usual, the underlying message was that we need to continue believing that we can do better for ourselves and for the sake of the children.



The 5th concert was in honour of the 150 years of work of the Holy Ghost Fathers in Trinidad. The production featured a cantata that explained the history of the Spiritans as well as music that celebrated the Jubilee Year of Faith. Incidentally, some of the boys of the Upper 6 graduating class of 2020, such as Tevin Cole, Jelani Frederick, Antonio Frontin and Brendan Hamel-Smith were part of the 2013 cast when they were in Form 1 and remained part of the production in some form or fashion through the years. Gifts of Blue & Gold 4, staged in November, 2012, was Fatima College's

contribution to our nation's ongoing celebrations of our 50th anniversary of Independence. The first three editions of the concert had no specific theme. Naturally, there were elements of the traditional talent show/Christmas Concert model, there was also some major theatrical work done like the mini-musical of GOBAG 3, "The Golden Girdle of Hippolyte" and selections from Broadway's "In The Heights", which for sentimental reasons was revived for Gifts of Blue & Gold 10.

#### The Future of GOBAG

Unfortunately, owing to the global pandemic of the Corona virus, the 12th staging of Gifts of Blue & Gold, originally carded for November 2020, is uncertain. Nonetheless, we live always in joyful hope that by God's Grace, there will be many more editions of Gifts of Blue and Gold for many years to come!



# Gifts of Blue & Gold XI



The Gifts of Blue & Gold production for the 2019-2020 academic year was themed "Melodies for His Majesty: Celebrating the Feast of Christ the King". As is customary, the show was presented in two Acts, with the first half having a particular theme and the second, a different focus but both working to poignantly deliver the message of the title of the production.

Toward the end of 2018, the musical genre of "Reggae" was added to a list of international cultural treasures which the United Nations has

deemed wo1thy of protecting and promoting. In honour of this accomplishment for Jamaica and in fact, the Region (and should be a source of inspiration for us as Trinbagonians that one day, Calypso & Soca will attain this status), Act I was replete with various reggae songs featuring the music of Bob Marley, Taurus Riley, Ziggy Marley, Chronixx, Duane Stephenson, Sizzla and Buju Banton. At the heart of this first half was an original mini-musical entitled "The Gospel According to Reggae" with a number of Fatima boys, both past and present, playing critical roles in writing the play: French & Spanish Teacher and Production Director, Mr. K wasi Noel (himself an alumnus of the College), Jelani Corbie of the class of 20 I 8, Daniel Roberts of the class of 2016 and Dante Gains of Lower 6, the first student to do Theatre Arts as a 9th CSEC subject in 2019. In addition, Form 5 student, Adam Bartholomew along with Mr. Akil Patrick also arranged other instrumental pa1ts for the play and he and Amari Boxill of Lower 6 arranged Beres Hammond's "Rock A way" for the Senior Steel Ensemble. The 2nd Act had more traditionally sacred music featuring an eclectic mix of music: many well-known songs, a few Christmas classics and the finale was David Rudder's timeless calypso of praise, "High Mas".

This 11th edition of Gifts of Blue & Gold featured a cadre of talented young men and women. Taking the stage from Fatima, was Liam Gooding (Form 2), David Isidore (Upper 6) and some newer lead voices that have grown over the years: Amari Box ill, playing the role of Jesus in the play of Act I, as well as Dante Gains, Brendan Hamel-Smith, Jonathan Joseph and Adrion Sangster. Joining the vocalists were our Form 5 dream team of musicians Matthew Newallo, Nicholas Gooding & Adam Bartholomew, Matthew D' Abadie (Lower 6) and Joshua Lewis (Form 4) on tenor pan, Justin Lubren and Luke Ali of Form 1 on guitar and drums respectively and our percussionists: Charles Grey (Form 2), Eric-Michael Dorant (Lower 6) and Kendall Belfon (Lower 6). As usual, there were performances by our various music groups: the Junior Steel Ensemble directed by Mr. Duvano Garnes, the Senior Steel Ensemble directed by Mr. Roy Edwards and the Fatima College Choirs: the Junior (with assistant direction by music teacher, Mr. Akil Patrick) and the Senior and the Mixed Choirs formed with girls of Holy Name Convent all directed by Mr. Kwasi Noel. All these performers were supported by the talent and expertise of retired Fatima Teacher, Ms. Myrtle Cumberbatch as lead accompanist. Holy Name Convent plays a critical role in the success of Gifts of Blue & Gold. This year, 23 girls joined us to form the Mixed Choir and among them were many dancers, singers and actresses including the young Calypso Queen herself, Sharissa Camejo, sister of one of our old boys, Sergio Camejo (Class of 2018).

Gifts of Blue & Gold 11 turned out to be a phenomenal artistic presentation and truly echoed, through movement and melodies, that Jesus Christ is the King of Goodness and Greatness and Salvation.



# House System & Sports Season Activities

In the 2009-2010 academic year, Fr. Gregory Augustine introduced a new House System. On the premise of emphasizing the strong Roman Catholic identity on which the college is founded, the six houses (Ryan, Byrne, Corcoran, Stewart, Craigwell and Archbishop) were disbanded and four new houses introduced based on the four gospels Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. Each House celebrates the Feast Day of the respective Saint, typically with a luncheon for the students and teachers of the House. The Feast Day celebrations are always a day of great excitement for House members and the staging of the event is organized by a team of parents, teachers, prefects and the Captain of each House.

The membership of the houses is based on one's class assignment at the Form 1 level. As a result, on entry into Fatima College, the students of 1-1 are placed in St. Matthew; 1-2, St. Mark; 1-3, St. Luke and 1-4, St. John. A student remains in his house for the duration of his stay at the college. When the new house system began, in order to avoid any confusion in the then Upper School (as there are 5 groups of Forms 4 and 5 and at the time, 2 groups of Lower 6 and Upper 6) the boys were placed in the houses based on the class to which they were assigned in Form 3. The signature colour of each House and evangelical symbol is as follows:

- St. Matthew Golden Yellow (Angel)
- St. Mark Green (Lion)
- St. Luke Red (Ox)
- St. John Royal Blue (Eagle)

The Sports Season begins with the annual 5k held on the second Saturday of November. In Term II, there are a series of sporting events typically including football and cricket. As the last decade progressed, rugby, basketball and table-tennis have been added to the line-up of competitions. The finale of these Pre-Sports Day events is the tug-of-war. Points are allocated to each house based on the results of each event. The Sports Day itself consists of a full program of traditional track & field events (100M, 200M, 400M, 800M and 4 x 100M Relay) for different age groups spanning the entire school population (under 14, under 15, under 17 & under 21). Additionally, each Form has a specific Novelty/Fun event. An important rule governing these events is that no one can participate in a novelty event and a field event.

The organization of the entire Sports Season serves to encourage the participation of as many boys as possible: athletes and non-athletes alike. Furthermore, it is hoped among the boys, enthusiasm and loyalty for their individual Houses will be fostered and will contribute to an overall sense of commitment and love of the college.

The Fatima College Table Tennis Club was formally founded by the Form 6 students Stephen Williams, Ethan Tardieu, Joshua Thomas and Luc O'Young during September 2019 and in that time has amassed 27 members. Prior to September, many students expressed an interest in playing table tennis within the school, thus the 6th Form students saw it fit to form a club to allow students to play recreationally as well as participate in tournaments. Training sessions were conducted once a week throughout the term by Luc and Stephen with persons playing recreationally every lunchtime.

During the 2019 Scotiabank Schools tournament (October) at which over 25 schools participated, the Under 15 boys team consisting of Luke Correia, Jacob Zamore and Zachary Fuller placed 1st, beating Presentation Chaguanas in the final. Additionally, in the Boys Open Singles category which had over 60 entries, Luc O'Young placed 1st. The club also participated in the Silver Bowl Juniors tournament in March with players representing the school in Under 13 and Under 15 age categories.


Congratulations to the Fatima Football first eleven team for an extremely successful campaign in the North Zone of the SSFL Championship division.





Fatima U14 rugby has had a very successful year yet again. For the third year in a row, Fatima has remained undefeated and won the U14 Trinidad and Tobago Schools Rugby Football Union league competition. The Fatima College Under 18 (U18) group saw its third consecutive year playing in a highly competitive league among 5 other schools only being defeated once by Trinity College Moka. The U18 team made it into the semi-final round this year subsequently being knocked out by our brother school St. Mary's College.

The 2019/2020 season saw the number of U14 players increase to the point where two teams were able to participate in the league, thus giving some of the newer players valuable experience playing matches. Although the 'B' team lost all their matches, the improvement over the weeks was evident, with one of their best performances being the match against the Fatima 'A' team. The U18 rugby team had two of our players being selected to train with the Trinidad and Tobago National U19 Rugby Team. We are hopeful that all our players make the short-list and will be able to continue to train with the team.
